2. Call- Second cohort (open)

In order to promote mobility activities between partners from Europe and Japan, the TEAM coordinators will soon launch the second cohort of fellows, for mobilities starting in September 2016.

Thus, they have launched a call to get **academic offers** for this call. These offers can only be submitted by Keio University, Tokyo University, UMPC/Inria research units, UMPC/CNRS research unit members. Candidates have also to be part of one of these institutions.

3. How to provide academic offers?

You have to complete the list with new academic offers, e.g. from faculties



who were not yet involved in our TEAM project.

Please use a new template (Academic offers TEAM.xls) attached. This document contains 4 sheets:

- 1. Academic offer of your institution
- 2. How to fill in the form
- 3. EU Subject codes (relates to the codes as submitted in the proposal)
- 4. Example

The attached document has to be sent to TEAM coordinators duly filled out no later than the 1st of November 2015 (an extension is possible).

Please note:

- Each partner should provide academic offers at all mobility levels: PhD, Post-docs and Staff.
- Available fields of study must be in line with ICT and with the mobility scheme:

PhD: either 6 or 12 months (around 1500 euros per month)

Post-docs: 9 months (around 1800 euros per month) Staff: 1 month (around 2500 euros per month)

- At the PhD level, if you wish to propose the same academic offer with two different durations (6 or 12 months), you should add two separate academic offers
- Mobilities have to start between 01/09/16 and 31/12/16 at the PhD and PD level. Staff mobilities can take place anytime during the academic year 2016-2017.
- Applicants will apply directly on the project website. They will select from the list of academic offers provided from each partner university.

Open applications

As well as applying to specific academic offers, applicants can also make "open application". This means that applicants can apply even when there is no specific academic offer proposed by a partner university. An open application should include an invitation letter from the host university clearly indicating the name of the hosting laboratory and a contact person.

If your institution is willing to receive open applications, please add a line by type of mobility in the excel sheet. Contact person for open applications should be the TEAM project manager of your institution.
